Answers to September's Parliamentary Quiz

1. The mover of a motion can speak against his/her own motion (False) The member who makes the motion can't speak against his or her own motion, although he or she can vote against it. The person who seconds the motion, however, can speak against the motion because a second means "Let's discuss it," not Answers "I agree." Sometimes a member seconds a motion so he or she can speak against it

2. A motion is before the assembly when is has been moved and seconded (True) Once your motion is presented to the membership by the chairman it becomes "assembly property", and cannot be changed by you without the consent of the members.

3. The motion to "Lay on the table" is used to kill a motion without a direct vote on it? (False) Under Robert's Rules, the subsidiary motion to lay on the table refers to temporarily setting aside a pending motion (or a series of pending motions) .to take care of something else deemed urgent. If the motion laid on the table isn't taken from the table by the next regular meeting, the motion dies

4. Amendments can be applied to any motion regardless to whether or not they are germane (False) Not all parliamentary motions can be amended and some motions are not subject to debate. For instance, a motion to adjourn the house can't be amended. Furthermore, incidental motions, such as parliamentary inquiries, points of order, and appeals for decisions by the chair are not subject to debate nor amendment. Therefore, any amendment should be relevant to the original proposal.
